#### **Special Announcement!**



The HTH Board of Directors is pleased to announce that HTH has recently reached an agreement with Planted Ministries which will allow for increased utilization of the camp for evangelism during our slower months of the year. "Planted," a new Gap Year program for college age students will lease certain parts of the HTH facility for their course of study that will run late August though early May.

The course of study of Planted involves Biblical training and discipleship, hands-on farming activities, out-door adventure, and life skill development in an intentional Christian community setting. Since the program involves instruction during the week, it will fit in nicely with the weekend retreats that HTH typically hosts in the Fall and Spring, while leaving the summer months free for the normal camping season.

Although the student body will not be large, they will be living on-site and will be volunteering as needed to assist HTH with the cleaning, kitchen work, snow removal and other operational activities that serve the retreat groups that utilize the camp.

The Planted program and the HTH retreat/camping program share many of the same staffing needs for food preparation, maintenance, and leadership. The two programs, working together in an integrated staffing model, will be in a much stronger position to meet these needs than either organization could do alone. Planted staffing will begin arriving at HTH this spring to prepare for their anticipated start date in late August of 2022.

After much prayer and consideration, the HTH Board of Directors feels strongly that this is an opportunity that God is presenting HTH to allow for increased staffing and greater utilization of the camp facilities for ministry while strengthening HTH's traditional program of retreats and summer camps.
